#### Grenada's 50th Independence Anniversary

 The Embassy hosted multiple events to mark this historic occasion, including an OAS Protocolary Meeting to receive the Prime Minister of Grenada and a Jubilee Year reception and awards ceremony at the OAS, an Independence Church Service, and a special event in collaboration with "Things to Do DC," collectively engaging over 600 attendees.

# **Cultural Diplomacy**

 Promoting Grenadian art and culture was a key priority. Notable activities included an Art Exhibition at the OAS attended by some 300 guests, an "Embassy Night on Capitol Hill" with over 200 participants, and featuring a talented Grenadian artist in residence whose work reached an estimated 10,000 people through our varied engagement channels.

# Diaspora Outreach

 The Embassy participated in eight main diaspora events across the U.S., from flagraising ceremonies in Boston to galas in Houston, South Virginia, and New York. We also facilitated meaningful connections between Grenadian authorities and diaspora members, including a town hall meeting with Prime Minister Dickon Mitchell that engaged some 150 participants.

According to the organizers, this year's Showcase saw participation from 68 embassies and attracted 8,000 attendees, the highest visitor rate since the event's inception in 2011.
